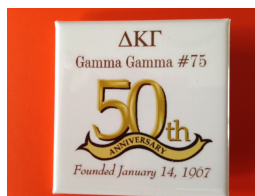
**6 nominees for membership** were presented by their sponsors. They are:

## **GERIE'S GIVE AND TAKE**

I must admit that I have not always read the DKG publications such as the Newscaster, News, Bulletin, Journal, etc. from cover to cover. I am more of a "skimmer" with attention to topics and pictures that interest me. However, once you get involved in Executive Board, you find valuable information in these. Did you know that currently one can receive all of these by "email"? I recently learned that the estimated cost of sending a first class letter to each member is almost \$40,000.

**Email messages have no cost.**

Even if we choose to receive all communications electronically, we must be sure that we are receiving information and keep current with any changes to our email addresses.

“A blast email in December to all members in the DKG data base went to 40,000 – 50,000 members. About 10,000 were returned as undeliverable for various reasons: outdated email addresses, deemed by the server as SPAM, due to the number of recipients, ‘.org’ emails rejected by school/institutional addresses.”

**Is your email on file correct and acceptable for emails from our organization?**

I know it will be a difficult choice for me to receive all DKG communications electronically, since I love having a hard copy in my hands. This choice is not mandatory. We can still receive “snail mail”.

I do see benefits: no piles of stuff lying around to be recycled later, saving paper and trees, savings of money for the organization, being informed promptly without waiting for mailings, and moving forward with technology skills.
