Project C.U.R.E. is the largest provider of donated medical supplies and equipment to developing countries around the world. **"Kits for Kids"** provide personal hygiene and basic medicine cabinet items that are scarce in the developing world. **Project C.U.R.E** developed these kits to give parents in these countries the supplies they need to provide basic care at home.
